DIRECTIONS:

Later's Diazinon Insect Spray will control Insects on Fruit, Vegetables and Ornamentals. The best time to apply is late evening or early morning. Spray when insects are active and damage is visible.

5 mL = 1 teaspoon

15 mL = 1 tablespoon

HOW TO USE:

Mix 5 mL with 1 L of water. Spray to cover both sides of the leaves. Repeat as necessary at 7-10 day intervals.

Controls: Aphids, Carrot rust flies, Caterpillars, Cucumber beetles, Flea beetles, Fruit flies, Leafhoppers, Leafminers, Mealybugs, Mites (Clover mites), Onion maggot flies, Pine shoot moths, Potato beetles, Rose chafers, Root weevils, Thrips, Whiteflies.

On fruit: Apples, Apricots, Cherries, Grapes, Peaches, Pears, Plums, Strawberries.

On Vegetables: Beans, Beets, Broccoli, Cabbage, Carrots, Cauliflower, Celery, Cucumber, Lettuce, Onions, Parsnips, Peppers, Radishes, Spinach, Tomatoes.

DAYS TO WAIT BEFORE HARVEST:

1 Day	- Tomatoes
5 Days	- Strawberries, Cauliflower, Peppers
7 Days	- Beans, Cabbage, Cucumber
10 Days	- Apricots, Cherries, Plums, Beets, Broccoli, Carrots, Celery, Lettuce, Onions, Parsnips, Radishes, Spinach
14 Days	- Apples, Pears
16 Days	- Grapes
20 Days	- Peaches

On Ornamentals: Azalea, Arborvitae, Birch, Boxwood, Carnations, Chrysanthemums, Holly, Ivy, Juniper, Oak, Pines, Roses.

PRECAUTIONS: KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN. Keep children and pets away from treated areas, at least until spray has dried. Harmful if swallowed. May be absorbed through skin. Avoid inhalation of spray mist. Avoid contact with skin or clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling with soap and water. Remove and launder contaminated clothing. Do not store or use near open flame. Avoid contamination of food or feedstuffs.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: Toxic to bees. Do not spray blooms. Toxic to fish. Do not contaminate lakes, ponds, streams.

FIRST AID:

IF SWALLOWED, do NOT induce vomiting. Contains petroleum distillate. Contact a doctor or poison control centre immediately.

IF IN EYES, flush with water for 15 minutes and get medical attention.

IF ON SKIN, remove contaminated clothing and wash skin thoroughly with soap and water.

TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION: Diazinon is a cholinesterase. Symptoms of poisoning; vomiting, nausea, headache, giddiness and eventually, coma. Atropine is antidotal.

STORAGE: Keep product in original container. Store in a cool, dry place away from food.

DISPOSAL: Do not re-use empty container. Rinse thoroughly and use rinse-water with regular spray. Wrap container and discard in household garbage.
