This rodenticide contains warfarin, an anticoagulant chemical that reduces the clotting ability of blood and upon repeated feeding causes fatal hemorrhage in rats and mice.

Registered in Canada for use in dwellings, farm buildings, food service establishments, granary bins (empty), processing plants (feed, food and nonfood), storage areas (feed, food, nonfood).

DIRECTIONS:

For norway rat (*Rattus norvegicus*), roof rat (*Rattus rattus*), and house mouse (*Mus musculus*), place the bait in locations frequented by such animals, such as tunnels, runways and feeding areas. For rats set out one pack, 454 g per station, for mice set out 50 to 100 g per station, 3 meters (10 ft.) apart. Replace bait that becomes damp and moldy. Maintain a constant supply until all feeding ceases.

In food processing plants place the bait in bait stations on the floor only. Do not place in overhead locations where contamination could occur. Do not put out bait while manufacturing is in progress. Do not put out near open food stuffs. For areas not directly related to food processing. Use only in non-food or non-feed areas where feed, food, packaging and handling equipment are never opened or exposed. For areas

where feed or food is processed, served or stored: In meat and food processing plants (processing areas) use only when plant is not in operation. Remove and cover all food, packaging material and utensils before placing bait in baiting stations. Remove all bait and dead rodents before re-use of the plant (processing areas include storage and service).

PRECAUTIONS:

KEEP OUT OF THE REACH OF CHILDREN, PETS, DOMESTIC ANIMALS and WILDLIFE. Do not expose treated bait in areas accessible to children, dogs, domestic animals, and wildlife except when enclosed within a tamper-resistant bait box. Keep away from feed and food stuffs. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wash arms, hands and face with soap and water after handling and before eating or smoking. Keep out of lakes, streams or ponds.

FIRST AID:

If in eyes, flush with water for 15 minutes. If on skin, wash with soap and water.

If swallowed, give patient one to two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with a finger or blunt object; repeat until vomit is clear. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Contact a physician or Poison Control Centre immediately.

TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION:

Vitamin K1 in the form of intravenous, intramuscular or subcutaneous injections, or by oral ingestion are suggested remedial treatments for anticoagulant poisoning. The severity of the case measured by establishing prolonged prothrombin times (P.T.) will determine appropriate therapy. Monitoring P.T. will indicate the necessity of repeated treatments.

DISPOSAL:

Do not reuse container. Dispose of unused or spoiled bait in accordance with local requirement. Follow provincial instructions for any required cleaning of the container prior to its disposal. Make the empty container unsuitable for further use. Dispose of the container in accordance with provincial requirements. For more information on the disposal of unused, unwanted product and the cleanup of spills, contact the provincial regulatory agency or the Manufacturer.

RODENT DISPOSAL:

Dispose of dead rodents in garbage or by burying.
