Cherry (Sour, Sweet) - Brown Rot, Leaf Spot (Shot-Hole) - 56 to 67 kilograms per hectare in the blossom and pre-harvest applications. May be applied up to 2 days before harvest of sweet cherries. May be applied up to 5 day before harvest of sour cherries. Do not apply by air.

Peach: Brown Rot and Scab - 56 to 67 kilograms per hectare in the blossom and pre-harvest applications May be applied up to 2 days before harvest. <u>Do not apply by air.</u>

Strawberries: Botrytis Rot - 34 to 45 kilograms per hectare beginning as soon as new growth starts. Repeat at about weekly intervals, up to harvest. Apply after each picking if conditions favour fruit rot. May be applied up to 2 days before harvest. Do not apply by air.

Cucumber: Anthracnose - Start application when runners begin to form or at the first sign of disease. Apply at a rate of 22.5 to 34 kilograms per hectare on young plants increasing to 34 to 45 kilograms per hectare on mature plants. May be applied up to 2 days before harvest. <u>Do not apply by air.</u>

Potato Seed Piece Treatment: Damp-Off, Seed Rot- Use at a rate of 250 grams per 25 kilograms cut seed pieces, (50 grams per 50 kilograms of cut seed pieces). Apply in a convenient container or by duster attachment over belt. Coat each piece evenly with a light film of dust. Treat pieces within 6 hours after cutting. Tomatoes: Anthracnose, Early and Late Blight, Gray Leaf Spot, Septoria Leaf Spot - Apply 34 to 45 kilograms per hectare at weekly intervals on young plants: 45 to 56 kilograms per hectare on mature plants. May ne applied up to 2 days before harvest. <u>Do not apply by air.</u>

Soil and Greenhouse Bench Treatment - Apply 1.25 kilograms per 100 square metres (112 kilograms per hectare). Work into upper 7.5 to 10 centimetres of soil before planting. For Dampoff and root rot diseases of seedlings and transplants of roses, other shrubs, flowers, lawn seedbeds and vegetables such as beans, peas, celery, cabbage, eggplant, pepper and tomato. <u>Do not apply by air.</u>

Ornamentals: Rose-Black Spot; Carnation-Leaf Spot; Chrysanthemum-Flower Blight - Apply thoroughly prior to or at first signs of disease. Repeat application at 7 to 10 day intervals. Shorten interval during periods of frequent rain and heavy dews. <u>Do not apply by air.</u>

Turf (golf courses and sod farms only): Brown Patch, Damp-Off, Leaf Spot, Root Rot -Apply 1 to 1.5 kilograms per 100square metres. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals as needed. **Melting-out -** apply 1 to 1.5 kilograms per 100 square metres beginning when grass resumes growth in the spring (March - April). Repeat qt 7 to 14 say intervals as long as cool, wet weather persists. The maximum application rte to turf (golf courses, sod farms) is 63 kgs of Captan 7.5 Dust per hectare with a maximum seasonal rate of 126.7 kgs/hectare. Do not apply to home lawns, parks, schools, sports fields and other recreational areas. <u>Do not apply by air.</u>
