PRECAUTIONS:

- 1. Keep out of reach of children.
- 2. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. May cause skin irritation.
- 3. Do not breathe spray mist or vapors. Avoid spray or vapor drifts onto susceptible plants such as grapes, tomatoes, tobacco, sugar beets, sunflowers, beans, turnips, cauliflower, cabbage, alfalfa, clover, peas, potatoes, ornamental trees, shrubs or flowers, fruit trees, lawns, most vegetable crops or other desirable vegetation.
- 4. Do not spray when there is any danger of wind or on exceptionally hot days over 27 deg. C.
- 5. Drift from spray may be reduced by using high volume sprays under low pressure, coarse sprays, and drop nozzles. Use special care in airplane application where danger from drift is greater.
- 6. For aerial application exercise special care:
 - 1) Do not spray in winds exceeding 8 km per hour.
 - 2) Do not spray in dead calm near sensitive plants. A cloud of suspended droplets may drift onto sensitive plants when the wind comes up.
 - 3) Spray only when the wind is blowing away from a sensitive crop, shelter belt or garden.
- 7. Do not contaminate any body of water. Avoid contamination of foods.
- 8. Do not use in a greenhouse.

- 9. Keep in original container during storage.
- 10. Do not store near or in same room as seeds, feeds, fertilizers or pesticides.
- 11. Keep away from fire or open flame and other sources of heat.
- 12. Clean spray equipment thoroughly after use. Do not use spray equipment for other purposes. DO not re-use empty containers.
