SUGGESTED USE: For control of Norway Rats, Roof Rats, House Mice in and around homes industrial and agricultural buildings. This product can be used in wet or damp locations such as river banks, railroad tracks, loading areas, in or around Rat holes, under granaries, along fences, garbage dumps, landfills, etc. All outdoor placements MUST be made in tamper-resistant bait stations. RATABAN "D" bait bags are equally effective in dry areas such as the insides of buildings and other protected areas.

Place baits in tamper-resistant bait stations along walls, in corners and concealed locations where Rats can feed undisturbed. Check bait stations daily and ensure that an uninterrupted supply of RATABAN "D" bait bags is available. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of bait for at least 15 days. Continue baiting until all signs of feeding have stopped.

DIRECTIONS. Determine areas where Rats and/or Mice will most likely consume the bait. Generally, these areas are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places between floors and walls, or in places where rodents or their signs have been observed. Use only in non-food or non-feed areas where feed, food, packaging and handling equipment are NEVER opened or exposed.

RATS: Place bait bags 6 to 9 metres apart.

MICE: Place bait bags 2 to 3 metres apart.

Keep treated areas well supplied. Bait should be available to rodents until complete lack of feeding is noticed. Never allow the treated areas to remain empty for over 48 hours.

PRECAUTIONS. KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN, PETS, DOMESTIC ANIMALS AND WILDLIFE. Do not expose treated areas accessible to children, dogs, domestic animals and wildlife except when enclosed within a tamper-resistant bait box. Keep away from feed or foodstuffs. Do NOT get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wash arms, hands and face with soap and water after handling and before eating or smoking. Keep out of lakes, streams and ponds.

FIRST AID: If in eyes, flush with water for 15 minutes. If on skin, wash with soap and water. If swallowed, give patient one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with a finger or blunt object, repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Do NOT give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Contact a physician or Poison Control Centre immediately.

TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION. Diphacinone is an anticoagulant. Vitamin K1, in the form of intravenous, intramuscular or subcutaneous injections, or by oral ingestion, is suggested remedial treatment for anticoagulant poisoning. The severity of the case measured by establishing prolonged prothrombin times (P.T.) will determine appropriate therapy. Monitoring P.T. will indicate the necessity of repeated treatments.

DISPOSAL. Do NOT reuse empty container. Dispose of unused or spoiled bait in accordance with local requirements. Follow provincial instructions for any required cleaning of the container prior to its disposal. Make the empty container unsuitable for further use. Dispose of the container in accordance with provincial requirements. For information on the disposal of unused, unwanted product and the cleanup of spills, contact the Provincial Regulatory Agency or manufacturer.

RODENT DISPOSAL: Dispose of dead rodents in garbage or by burying.
