

Evaluation Report for Category B, Subcategory 3.4 Application

Purpose of Application

The purpose of this application was to remove restriction of aerial application statement “DO NOT APPLY BY AIR” from the Amigo Adjuvant label.

Chemistry Assessment

Chemistry assessment was not required for this application.

Health Assessments

No unacceptable risk is expected when workers follow the label directions and wear the personal protective equipment identified on the label.

Amigo Adjuvant is to be used with Select Emulsifiable Concentrate Post-Emergence Herbicide (PMRA No. 22625; 240 g/L clethodim) and Centurion Emulsifiable Concentrate Post-Emergence Herbicide (Reg. No. 27598; 240 g/L clethodim). Given that the crops treated with Select and Centurion by aerial application are registered at the same rates, application number and PHI as on the respective registered labels by ground application, and that the minimum application volume for application by air is 28 L/ha, application of Select or Centurion by air is not expected to change the residue profile for Amigo adjuvant. Therefore, the dietary exposure to food and drinking water is not expected to increase and will not pose an unacceptable risk to any segment of the population, including infants, children, adults and seniors.

Environmental Assessment

No environmental risk assessment was required as aerial application will not result in higher environmental risk. Aerial application was previously supported by the PMRA for emergency requests at the same number and rate of application.

Value Assessment

The removal of the restriction to aerial application is acceptable from a value perspective based on the concurrent approval of the aerial application use pattern for Select EC Herbicide (application number 2011-1664) and Centurion EC Herbicide (application number 2011-1545).

Conclusion

The PMRA has reviewed the information provided in support of this application and determined the removal of the restriction of aerial application statement “DO NOT APPLY BY AIR” from the Amigo Adjuvant label is acceptable.

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
