PRECAUTIONS: KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN

Avoid breathing vapors or spray mist. May cause minimal eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Applicators and other handlers must wear protective eyewear, long pants and long-sleeved shirt, waterproof gloves, shoes plus socks. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse.

Apply only when the potential for drift to areas of human habitation or areas of human activity such as houses, cottages, schools, and recreational areas is minimal. Take into consideration wind speed, wind direction, temperature inversion, application equipment, and sprayer settings.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS:

To reduce runoff from treated areas into aquatic habitats, avoid application to areas with a moderate to steep slope, compacted soil, or clay. Avoid application when heavy rain is forecast. Contamination of aquatic areas as a result of runoff may be reduced by including a vegetative strip between the treated area and the edge of the water body.

FIRST AID:

RESISTANCE MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS: For resistance management, please note that WINFIELD PHOSPHITE EXTRA Fungicide contains a Group 33 fungicide. Any fungal population may contain individuals naturally resistant to WINFIELD PHOSPHITE EXTRA Fungicide and other Group 33 fungicides. A gradual or total loss of pest control may occur over time if these fungicides are used repeatedly in the same sites. Other resistance mechanisms that are not linked to site of action but specific for individual chemicals, such as enhanced metabolism, may also exist. Appropriate resistance management strategies should be followed.

To delay fungicide resistance:

• Where possible, rotate the use of WINFIELD PHOSPHITE EXTRA Fungicide or other Group 33 fungicides with different groups that control the same pathogens.

• Fungicide use should be based on an IPM program that includes scouting, historical information related to pesticide use and crop rotation and considers cultural, biological and other chemical control practices.

Monitor treated fungal populations for sign of resistance development. If disease continues to progress after treatment with this product, do not increase the use rate. Discontinue use of this product, and switch to another fungicide with a different target site of action, if available.
Contact your local extension specialist or certified crop advisors for any additional pesticide resistance-management and/or IPM recommendations for specific crops and disease problems in your area.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

DO NOT contaminate irrigation or drinking water supplies or aquatic habitats by cleaning of equipment or disposal of waste.

As this product is not registered for the control of pests in aquatic systems, DO NOT use to control aquatic pests.

DO NOT apply using aerial application equipment.

Some research has indicated that products containing mono- and di-potassium salts of phosphorous acid may increase the uptake of certain metals into plants, thus care must be taken when using tank mixes containing pesticide products with a metal base (such as copper based fungicides) and/or micronutrients that may not be compatible and could potentially cause plant injury.

Mono- and di-potassium salts of phosphorous acid represent a reduced form of phosphate, often referred to as phosphite. There is **NO** scientific literature that supports the efficacy of phosphite as a source of nutritional phosphorous. Care must be taken to ensure proper plant nutrition when using phosphite in a spray regime. In extreme cases where phosphite is used on soils where there is an excess of phosphorous acid alkali metal salts, phosphate starvation may result.

Crop varieties may vary in their tolerance to mono- and di-potassium salts of phosphorous acid. Since not every variety of crops have been tested for tolerance to mono- and di-potassium salts of phosphorous acid, first use of this product should be limited to a small area of each variety, to confirm tolerance prior to adoption as a general field practice. Additionally, consult your seed supplier for information on the tolerance of specific varieties of each crop to mono- and dipotassium salts of phosphorous acid.

GENERAL APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

WINFIELD PHOSPHITE EXTRA FUNGICIDE may be applied as foliar sprays, soil drenches or through sprinkler chemigation according to the crop-specific use directions. For foliar sprays, apply WINFIELD PHOSPHITE EXTRA FUNGICIDE with sufficient water to ensure adequate coverage of foliage, according to crop and growth stage. To insure good coverage, spray to wet but avoid run-off.

GENERAL PRECAUTIONS FOR APPLICATIONS THROUGH SPRINKLER IRRIGATION SYSTEMS

Apply this product only through center pivot, or solid set. Do not apply this product through any other type of irrigation system. Crop injury, lack of effectiveness or illegal pesticide residues in the crop can result from non-uniform distribution of treated water. If you have questions about calibration, contact local Extension Service specialists, equipment manufacturers or other experts. Do not connect an irrigation system (including greenhouse systems) used for pesticide application to a public water system unless the pesticide label-prescribed safety devices for public water systems are in place. A person knowledgeable of the chemigation system and responsible for its operation or under the supervision of the responsible person, shall shut the system down and make necessary adjustments should the need arise.

The sprinkler irrigation system must contain a functional check valve, vacuum relief valve and low-pressure drain appropriately located on the irrigation pipeline to prevent water source contamination from backflow. The pesticide injection pipeline must contain a functional, automatic, quick-closing valve to prevent the flow of fluid back toward the injection pump. The pesticide injection pipeline must also contain a functional, normally closed, solenoid-operated valve located on the intake side of the injection pump and connected to the system interlock to prevent fluid from being withdrawn from the supply tank when the irrigation system is either automatically or manually shut down. The system must contain functional interlocking controls to automatically shut off the pesticide injection pump when the water pump motor stops. The irrigation line or water pump must include a functional pressure switch, which will stop the water pump motor when the pressure decreases to the point where pesticide distribution is adversely affected. Systems must use a metering pump, such as a positive displacement injection pump (e.g., diaphragm pump) effectively designed and constructed of materials that are compatible with pesticides and capable of being fitted with a system interlock.

Do not apply when wind speed causes non-uniform distribution and/or favors drift beyond the area intended for treatment.

When applying through sprinkler irrigation systems, apply continuously for the duration of the water application. After treatment has been completed, avoid further irrigation of the treated area until foliage is dry or for 24 to 48 hours.

Do not apply by chemigation if the area to be treated is within 100 metres of a residential area or park.

MIXING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Fill the spray tank with 1/2 of the required volume of water.

2. Add WINFIELD PHOSPHITE EXTRA FUNGICIDE slowly to the tank and agitate by hydraulic or mechanical means.

3. Continue to fill the tank with water to the desired volume while agitating.

4. Continue agitation when applying.
