DIRECTIONS: To control aphids, red spider mites, rose chafers, rose leafhoppers and certain chewing insects, dust the upper and lower leaf surfaces lightly and evenly. Application is recommended before early morning dew dries. Dusting at other times is less effective. Repeat at frequent intervals. Helps control powdery mildew and black spot. NOTE: 1. Do not use on Boston ivy or virginia creeper. 2. HIGHLY TOXIC TO BEES. 3. Do not refill more than 2/3 full. 4. Do not apply when temperature is above 27'C.

CAUTIONS: KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN. Poisonous if swallowed. Never handle material with bare hands. Use rubber gloves; do not use leather or cloth gloves. If syrup of ipecac is not available, give the patient one to two glasses of water and cause vomiting by inserting a finger down the throat. Repeat with water until vomit fluid is clear. The patient should be lying down with the head below the level of the feet. DO NOT TRY TO CAUSE VOMITING IF THE PATIENT IS UNCONSCIOUS OR IN A CONVULSIVE STATE.
