Ants, sod webworms	Spray until wet. Spot treat only in areas of infestation.
Chinch bugs	Spray until wet. Spot treat only in areas of infestation. Water lightly before and after application. Repeat in 7-10 days if necessary.
Earwigs	Spot treat only in areas of infestation.
BROADCAST APPLICATION	
FOR USE ON LAWNS TO CONTROL:	DIRECTIONS:
White grubs (suppression)	When sampling indicates that white grub larvae are actively feeding in the root zone apply 1L/280 sq. metres. Thoroughly water the product into the lawn after treatment. Do not use in areas where the thatch is more than 3 cm thick. Apply anytime between the first of April and the end of October when grubs are close to the surface (top 5 cm of soil) (2 inches). Container covers 280 sq. metres (3,000 sq. ft.).
